

# 5 clever ways with WASTED SPACE

Squeeze every inch out of your bathroom, no matter its size, with these inventive ideas



**1** Borden Interiors stole space from behind the shower to add extra floor-to-ceiling shelving – ideal for extra towels. The custom shelves were made by MOCA Handcrafted; for similar, try the Walnut Floating shelf kit, £32.24, Mastershelf.



**2** Here, recessed nooks were created around the structural steel of the roof. Harlequin bathroom tiles, £1.32 per tile, Porcelain Superstore. The bathroom was part of a whole-house renovation, which cost £180,000, by Iguana Architects.

**3** The door of this frameless toilet roll and brush holder can be designed to seamlessly blend in with your wall finish, whether it's tile or timber, and is connected directly to the wall, brickwork or metal studs. From £600, Ripples.



**4** Interior designer Laura Stephens decided to take the cabinetry all the way up to the sloped ceiling to add storage for towels and toiletries, with cubby holes optimising wasted space. A similar solution would cost around £1000 to £1500.

**5** Take advantage of high ceilings by incorporating hidden storage disguised as panelling. Interior designer Caroline Cobbold cleverly recessed medicine cabinets into the walls either side of the bath to save on precious floor area, providing ample room for towels and toiletries. The bathroom project cost around £10,800.

Pick and mix inserts to create the drawer organisation you need. This is Modulnova's Moon Cross unit in matt lacquer in grey, featuring a satinised glass vanity top with integral basin. Modulnova's bathroom furniture starts from £2000, Designspace London.



If you need to retrofit shower storage but find stick-on solutions a nightmare, Simplehuman's Tension shower caddy, £119.95, could help. It works on a high-compression spring, so fits securely between your floor and ceiling, providing three adjustable shelves.
